SUCCESS TIPS CHECKLIST FOR CRICUT KNIFE BLADE

Only use desktop version of Design Space (no iOS devices). Use in a dedicated browser window. Don't open new tab to do something while you are cutting. Open a new browser window if you need to use internet while cutting.

Calibrate the Knife Blade before first use...follow steps in Design Space, ok to re-calibrate whenever cut seems off

Trim your material to no wider than 11" . Maximum cut size is 10.5 w X 11.5 or 10.5 X 23.5

[] Minimum image size to cut is 0.75" X 0.75" (includes interior and exterior cuts). Width of cuts should not be smaller than diameter of a pencil

Use Strong Grip Purple Mat to hold your material in place. Add masking or painters tap around the edges of your material to hold on the mat. Use a Brayer to help with good adhesion to the mat all across your material

Don't forget to put your material right side down on the mat and MIRROR your image in Design Space at cut screen

Before you cut, move the 4 white roller grips all the way to the right side of the bar to keep them from marking your material as you cut

[] Turn off sleep mode on your computer so it doesn't interrupt your cut

Be patient – it may take a while for your knife blade project to cut out. Monitor while it is cutting for jams or debris. Use Project Resume if Cricut head flashes indicating clear debris.

ALWAYS "Check Your Cut" before you remove completed project mat from Cricut Maker. Go ahead and select one more pass if it needs another cut.

What can Knife Blade Cut?

- Garment Leather Soft treated leather 2-3 oz and 4-5 oz
- Tooling Calf Leather Stiff Tanned leather 2-3 oz, 4-5 oz, 6-7 oz
- Balsawood 1/32", 1/16", 3/32"
- Basswood 1/32", 1/16"
- Chipboard Cricut Brand Only 2mm (1/16")
- Matboard 2 ply, 4 ply (no thicker than 2mm)
- Craft Foam 3mm, 2 mm, 1.5mm
